

Suggested Interview Questions for Lee Strobel **Author of the *New York Times* Bestseller *The Case for Christ***

1. You wrote *The Case for Christ* in 1998. How has your faith changed, and what questions do you ask about Christianity now?
2. You have some great stories about people who have been influenced by the book. Can you share one or two with us?
3. What was the most difficult question you asked while writing this book? Did you find the answer surprising?
4. You write in *The Case for Christ* that after your investigation was over, it would have taken more faith for you to maintain your atheism than become a Christian. Do you ever wrestle with doubt today?
5. Did you ask any questions that could not be answered; as in, faith is the only answer?
6. You took a very rational approach to questions regarding religion. How do faith and rationality interact? Is a “leap of faith” still required when approaching religion rationally?
7. What was the biggest criticism you received for your book? How did you respond to this criticism?
8. Why do you think your book has resonated with so many people? Do you think it will last with upcoming generations?
9. Would you recommend your book to spiritual skeptics over seasoned Christians? What can a mature Christian take away from your book?
10. Which theologians and books inspire you?
