

Suggested Interview Questions for Lee Strobel Author of *The Case for Miracles*

1. The story of your journey from atheism to faith was published in *The Case for Christ* in 1998. How did you view miracles before you became a Christian? How has that changed in the years since then?
2. How do you define a miracle?
3. What do you say to skeptics who claim that miracles are impossible because they violate the laws of nature?
4. You partnered with Barna Research to conduct a scientific survey, asking Americans about their thoughts on the miraculous. What did you discover? Do many Americans believe in miracles? How many claim to have experienced a miracle?
5. You interviewed multiple experts for your new book, *The Case for Miracles*. It's interesting that the first interview is with a bona fide skeptic of religion and miracles, Michael B. Shermer, editor of *Skeptic* magazine. Why did you lead with Dr. Shermer?
6. Your interview with Craig Keener addressed the reasoning of philosopher David Hume. Why do so many sceptics follow his reasoning – and why do you see his case as lacking?
7. You document unexplainable events that people describe as miracles. Many are miraculous healings. What's the most dramatic case? Do doctors affirm that these events have occurred? Do scientific studies support or undermine miracle claims?
8. What about dreams and visions? What evidence is there that God reaches out to people in this way?
9. You have given the label “the granddaddy of all miracles” to the creation of our world. What's the most persuasive evidence for a supernatural Creator?
10. Your book comes out at Easter. Can you summarize the historical evidence for the resurrection of Jesus? Why is this the cornerstone of the Christian faith?
11. In your book, theologian Roger Olson says many American churches seem embarrassed by the supernatural. What did he mean? Do you agree with him?
